Aide Memoire: Meeting with Iwi Leaders on the Mixed Ownership Model, 1pm, Thursday 19 January

The Minister of Finance and the Prime Minister are meeting with four iwi leaders tomorrow. The leaders are Tuku Morgan, Mark Solomon, Tumu Te Heuheu and Api Mahiapua.

The meeting is a prelude to the formal portion of the consultation process with Māori on the implications of the mixed ownership model and the legislation. It arose from the confluence of two events – a request from Tuku Morgan to meet, and a similar recommendation from Sir Wira Gardiner, the Crown's facilitator for the consultation.

The timing for 19 January reflects a desire to meet prior to the celebrations at Ratana on 24 January. [4]
