## Part A - Statement of Objectives and Trends

### Part A1 - Objectives for Vote

#### *Related Outcomes for Women*

The Ministry of Women's Affairs is the Government's primary provider of gender-specific advice. The appropriations to Vote Women's Affairs will contribute towards the Government's achievement of three high-level outcomes identified in the *Action Plan for New Zealand Women* (see Note 1). They are:

- the improved economic independence of women in New Zealand
- greater work-life balance in New Zealand
- the improved quality of life and well-being for all New Zealand women.

By focusing on these outcomes, a contribution will also be made towards the Government priorities for public sector policy of economic transformation, families - young and old, and national identity.

#### *Output Expenses*

The appropriations are intended to fund activities that fall into the broad area of Policy Advice and Nominations Service. This includes:

- monitoring progress on the *Action Plan for New Zealand Women*
- providing policy advice to achieve improved outcomes for women
- providing nominations for the appointment of women to state sector governance bodies
- managing the Government's international obligations in relation to the status of women.

The focus of these activities will be the priorities stated in the *Action Plan for New Zealand Women*.

### Part A2 - Trends in Vote

#### *Output Trends: 2001/02 to 2006/07*

The Ministry of Women's Affairs was established in 1986 to provide gender-specific policy advice to the Government. Significant fluctuations in appropriations over the last five years are summarised below.

Appropriations were increased to bolster policy capability and allow further capability issues to be addressed as follows:

- \$355,000 (2001/02 to 2003/04)

- \$267,000 (2004/05 only)
- \$356,000 (2005/06 and outyears).

A number of special projects were also funded:

- Assisting attendance at Women's Leaders Network meeting in Mexico (\$20,000 in 2002/03 only).
- Completion of a national memorial for women to coincide with the 110th anniversary of suffrage (\$58,000 in 2002/03 only).
- 'Improving Pacific Women's Wellbeing' project (\$80,000 in 2003/04 and 2004/05), funded by an allocation from the Cross Departmental Research Pool.

Appropriations were also increased by funding from other Departments including:

- Recovery of employer contribution to the 'State Sector Retirement Saving Scheme' (\$7,000 in 2003/04, \$29,000 in 2004/05, and \$68,000 in 2005/06 and outyears).
- Recovery of staff secondment and project management costs (\$26,000 in 2005/06 only).

Appropriations of \$71,000 were transferred from 2003/04 to 2004/05 for the deferral of projects.
