Part 2 - Details and Expected Performance for Output Expenses

Part 2.1 - Departmental Output Expenses

Supervision and Conduct of Crown Prosecutions (M5)

Scope of Appropriation

The provision of a national Crown prosecution service that undertakes criminal trials on indictment and appeals to the High Court; the supervision of the network of Crown Solicitors who deliver the prosecution service; and the provision of advice on criminal law matters to other government agencies and Crown Solicitors.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation will increase by \$4 million to \$39.542 million for 2009/10. The increase will be used to fund the immediate cost pressures that have unexpectedly arisen from the introduction of reforms in the criminal justice system (eg, new committal process).

The Exercise of Principal Law Officer Functions (M5)

Scope of Appropriation

Providing legal advice, representation services and administrative services to the Attorney-General and Solicitor-General to assist them in the exercise of their Principal Law Officer functions; and the provision of legal and constitutional advice to the Government, Ministers, and the judiciary.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation will increase by \$434,000 to \$3.412 million for 2009/10. The increase relates to:

- the immediate cost pressures that have unexpectedly arisen from the introduction of reforms in the criminal justice system (\$300,000)
- the Government Legal Services (GLS) Project Contribution from other government departments (\$169,000)
- the suspended Senior Counsel application process (-\$50,000).
