Scope of Appropriation

Advice on generic Treaty issues and specific historical Treaty claims. Negotiation of historical Treaty claims. Where appropriate, the preparation of settlement legislation, property valuation, disclosure and preparation and execution of legal documentation required to enable the transfer of settlement assets to claimants.

#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The appropriation has increased by \$825,000 to \$22.345 million, mainly due to:

- an increase due to a transfer of \$900,000 from Representation: Waitangi Tribunal reflecting lower caseloads in the Waitangi Tribunal and to support the Government's aspirational goal to settle historical Treaty of Waitangi claims by 2014
- a \$75,000 transfer to Vote Agriculture & Forestry to fund the commissioning of an independent
  assessment to assess the size and scope of erosion issues in the Waiapu catchment, as provided for
  in the Deed of settlement signed by the Crown and Ngāti Porou on 22 December 2010
- a reduction of \$3.400 million in Revenue from Other and a corresponding increase in Revenue from Crown to correct an error in the allocation of the revenue source for this appropriation.

## Representation - Waitangi Tribunal (M74)

## Scope of Appropriation

Allows the Crown to undertake research into historical Treaty grievances and ensures the Crown is represented with well prepared documentation and evidence at Waitangi Tribunal hearings.

The appropriation increased by \$15.800 million as a result of new funding of \$11 million approved during 2010/11 to fund additional Landbank purchases and meet the expected cost of properties purchased from core government departments for the Landbank, plus a \$4.800 million transfer from 2010/11 to complete purchases that had been committed to but had been delayed.
