I provided a verbal submission at the Iwi consultation hui in Otautahi on 14th Feb.

Here is a summary of my verbal submission:

1. I tautoko Mark Solomon and his comment that the very limited timeframe given for this submission process is a breach of Section 9.
2. I personally do not support to sale of these assets. The should be used instead to grow our economy by focusing them on developing renewable energy technology and thus expanding our revenue from them creating additional jobs for our people.
3. If the assets are to be sold then I tautoko Ta Tipene O'Regan's concern about intergenerational ownership and benefit. I therefore propose that the assets can only be sold to IWI / ACC / KiwiSaver / KiwiSuperannuation / Whai Rawa and/or similar New Zealand organisations whos' only purpose is to support the financial well being of New Zealand citizens.
4. I tautoko the comments by Sacha McMeeking and Rahui Katene that Section 9 be transferred to the new legislation. But that we also take this opportunity to strengthen this clause.
