**Title:** Māori and Pasifika Trades Training Evaluation

**Description:** Māori and Pasifika Trades Training (MPTT) aims to improve Māori and Pasifika participation and achievement in trades training to help meet high priority skills needs and improve employment outcomes. Surplus 2016/17 MPTT funds will be used to fund an evaluation to identify strengths and weaknesses of the MPTT programme, how it might be made more effective, and what can be learned about using a consortium-based approach.
