### Additional Item: Funding Requests in Response to 15 March Terror Attacks

**Portfolio**                      **Finance**

On 10 June 2019, Cabinet:

- 1        **noted** that the Minister of Finance is putting in place a process to coordinate funding requests in response to the 15 March terror attacks so that the initiatives can be considered together;
- 2        **noted** that agencies will be required to demonstrate that initiatives are a direct result of the 15 March terror attacks, are urgently needed to respond to the attacks, and that they have sought to fund the initiatives from within baselines, including considering reprioritisation opportunities;
- 3        **noted** that the Minister of Finance intends to ask a group of Ministers to assist him in considering the initiatives, including Hon Dr Megan Woods (lead Minister for coordinating the government response in Christchurch), Associate Ministers of Finance (Hon David Clark and Hon James Shaw) and the Minister of Internal Affairs;
- 4        **noted** that the Minister of Finance intends to report back to Cabinet with recommendations on the funding initiatives in August or early September 2019.
