Build Programme
- **Description:** This initiative is to fund the operation of the Progressive Home Ownership scheme that will provide access to homeownership to improve the wellbeing of target households in terms of meeting their housing needs, and will have flow-on benefits such as improved security of housing tenure, access to building household wealth and housing related health and social outcomes.

The scheme will incorporate targeted programmes focused on Māori outcomes including but not limited to a whānau Māori pilot programme, supported by a partnership approach with Māori housing services providers to build urban papakāinga on general title land to complement Te Ara Mauwhare trials on Māori land.
