Dear

Thank you for your Official Information Act (OIA) request, received on 10 May 2022. You requested:

All Treasury advice to Ministers or other agencies or documents more generally that consider whether the Three Waters reforms should include or consider a provision for buying water assets from local councils?

Please also include any such advice or documents provided when the Three Waters process was still a "review", prior to July 1, 2020. For clarity my request is not limited to this "review" period and also covers the post July 1, 2020 period when the programme is called Three Waters reform.

My request includes, but is not limited to, any consideration that the \$2.5b 'no worse off' and 'better off' funding (\$1b from the Crown, and the remaining \$1.5b to be raised against the proposed new water entities in or after 2024) should or could be considered a purchase price for the council's water assets?
