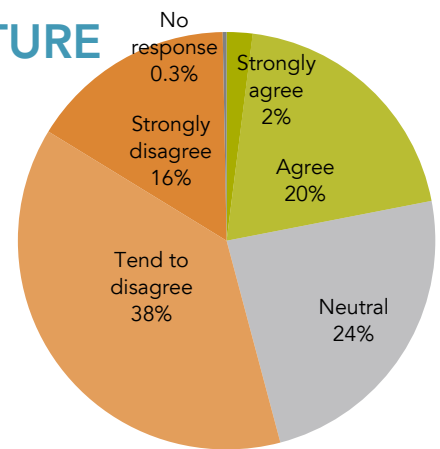
COMMON THEMES IN 18 DISASTER REPORTS

- INSUFFICIENT OVERSIGHT

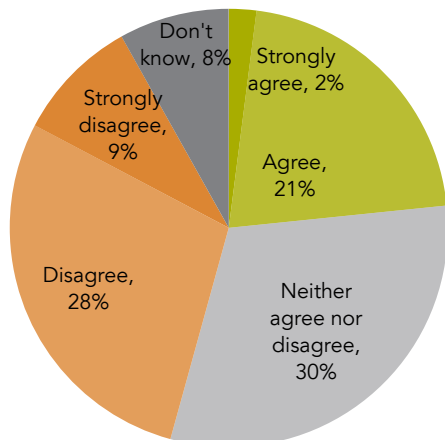
WEAK LEADERSHIP AND WRONG CULTURE IN NZ REGULATORS

INEFFECTIVE MONITORING OF REGULATORS

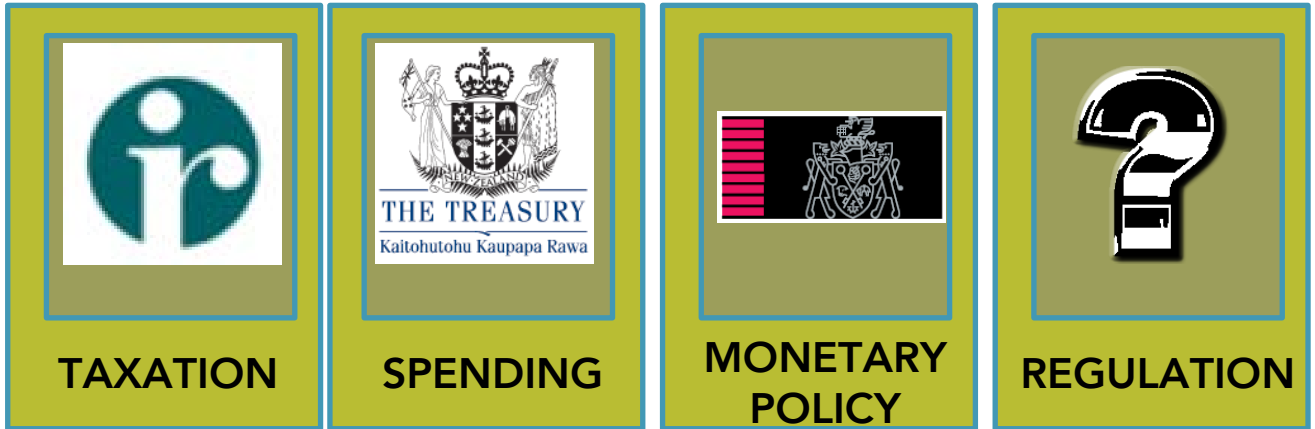
